Presidents Report

A second successive frustrating season has passed with significant disruptions caused by the Covid-19 pandemic. Not exactly the best way to celebrate our 70th anniversary, the celebration of which had to be cancelled.

I feel for all our members who were affected in some way by Covid and thank you, that despite these disruptions, you still continued as best you could to keep the club running and the public safe in the water.

Under Faron's leadership, the Board and operational committees have worked hard to make sure we continued as best we could and the club has come through this troubled year in pretty good shape. Thanks again to our paid staff and coaches who have had to continue to operate in a challenging environment.

A significant event for surf lifesaving this year was that for the first time Surf Lifesaving New Zealand received direct funding from central Government. This was long overdue and for us, partly underwrites our ability to fund operating expenses, equipment replacement and capital work on our building and is a step closer to surf lifesaving being recognised as a core essential emergency service.

We have continued to receive good support from our sponsors even in uncertain times. More than ever, we value their generosity and support.

She gained her lifeguard award in 1983 and was an active lifeguard for 25 years.

She has held positions as an instructor, coach, manager and sat on a number of various club committees. She sat on the club Board as Treasurer for 11 years.

Fun fact – Deb was coach of the Junior team that won the Cath and Eddie Millar Cup for the first time in the early 1990s.

Deb competed for 10 years and that led her into a surf official role where she has been an official for nearly 20 years.

Deb's service to surf lifesaving has been recent with Distinguished Service Awards at both regional and national level.

Tom joined us in 2004 when he came to NZ from England for a summer holiday. He's still here.

He has managed to cram in a huge amount of work into the time he has been with us and he has been a significant influence on lifeguards at Orewa and throughout the Northern Region for the last nearly 20 years.

He brought a wealth of lifeguarding experience from his time working as a lifeguard in England and he quickly became a mainstay of our lifeguarding operations as a Patrol Captain, instructor, eventually becoming Club Captain and currently Director of Lifesaving.

He was a significant driver in lifting our operations to a more professional footing and he introduced SUP Boards being used as a surf life saving craft.

He was an active competitor for 12 years and holds the honour of being the youngest person ever to compete in the Masters at age 22. Something to do with the hairline.

At a higher level he has sat on a number of SLSNR committees and has been an Examiner for 13 years. He is also a Surf Official.

He has been recognised at regional level with a Distinguished Service Award and at national level with a Service Award.

He remains an active contributor to the club and with a new generation of Burgess' coming along he is sure to be with us for many years to come.

Lifesaving Chair's Report



2020/21 was a great year for lifesaving at Orewa.

As a club we successfully developed some of our members in skills and leadership, provided a safe environment for beachgoers and were prepared to respond to any incidents. But it isn't done by just one person and comes down to hundreds of our Orewa club members getting involved.

This season, 181 lifeguards and patrol supporters volunteered to providing patrols to a total of over 3700 hours for Orewa SLSC. This is something we should be really proud of. They say that many hands make light work and when we have that many people involved, it helps us in keeping our beach safe. Our beaches were busier, with a lack of international travel, and these patrols at both Wenderholm and Orewa beaches saw positive outcomes in 6 rescues, 14 searches and 90 first aid incidents, so our season wasn't without some action.

But with so many involved in our service, a lot of time and work has to go into training and development, and this season was no different for need, although hindered by COVID at times.

We saw 35 new lifeguards join our ranks and within our existing lifeguards and patrol supports, 48 First Aid qualifications were gained or refreshed, 21 IRB crew and driver qualifications gained and 1 new instructor successfully qualified to be able to help in our future training. This couldn't have been done without our instructors and examiners in the clubs helping keep us going and growing.

Other development for our lifeguards took place with experiences, camps and courses in leadership and beach management at a regional level which are skills they will be able to apply through life and on beaches in the future.

Our callout squad was relatively inactive this season for emergencies, but still remained prepared.

We lifeguarded numerous sport and community events, which gave our members other lifeguarding experiences as well as helping grow our community profile.

And to all of you looking for the next thing to do with lifesaving in the club, these should be some of the avenues you look to target next season.

Well done and thank you to all those members who have been active on the beach this season as

well as those in the background. Thank you for your time, energy and support to the service we provide. Thank you for volunteering your time to upskilling and to keeping our community safe.

It's been an amazing season, topping the charts post Covid with 437 junior members running around our beach on Sunday mornings. That's a massive increase from 300 last year. The Jr committee put in many passionate hours to ensure that the experience was well balanced for all our new and existing members. Sharing equipment and resources while also being creative with the activities to keep even the youngest of our members keen. We pride ourselves on accepting all those who want to be members. The more children (and parents) we can educate to protect our youth in the water, the better. While all the time knowing that we are supporting building the pool of active lifeguards of the future. With that comes a huge responsibility and many volunteers to make sure we get this right. So a huge shout out to all those who jump in the water to be safety, who run the sausage sizzle for a shared lunch, who coach, manage and wrangle the kids for activities, who support the set up and clean-up of gear, who are active lifeguards to keep a watchful eye over our members while training in the surf and those who are on the Junior committee setting the strategy, policy and processes, all these things are critical to success.



We continue to develop our program around our 3 Es:

Education in all things lifesaving, Experience of putting skills into action in fun and testing events, and opportunities to Exemplify what it means to be part of our club, part of Lifesaving through living our R.E.A.L. (Respect, Environment, Attitude, Leadership) values. After two seasons using these as a basis for our decision making, the Jr committee are getting a handle on what is working and what needs to evolve to meet the needs of our members. We are still learning and up for constructive feedback as we know we are building the foundations for a sustainable and

successful program into the future.

Our family camp was another great success, with all of our equipment trailers filled up with gear to facilitate training sessions on Ruakaka beach. It's been a few years since we've seen that and it's awesome to welcome in a whole new group of families into this fun time over the new year holidays. It's definitely a highlight of the season for both the children and the parents alike.

With the numbers up, the theme continues with the enrolment into the Jr carnivals this season. We had an increase across both participation and competitive carnivals. We know that children who attend the carnivals are more likely to stay in surf club due to the shared experiences with their peers, achieving personal milestones while increasing their confidence. This is an area we will continue to communicate, encourage and support our youth in being involved with – it's one of our E's = Experience, and key to being 'In it for Life'.

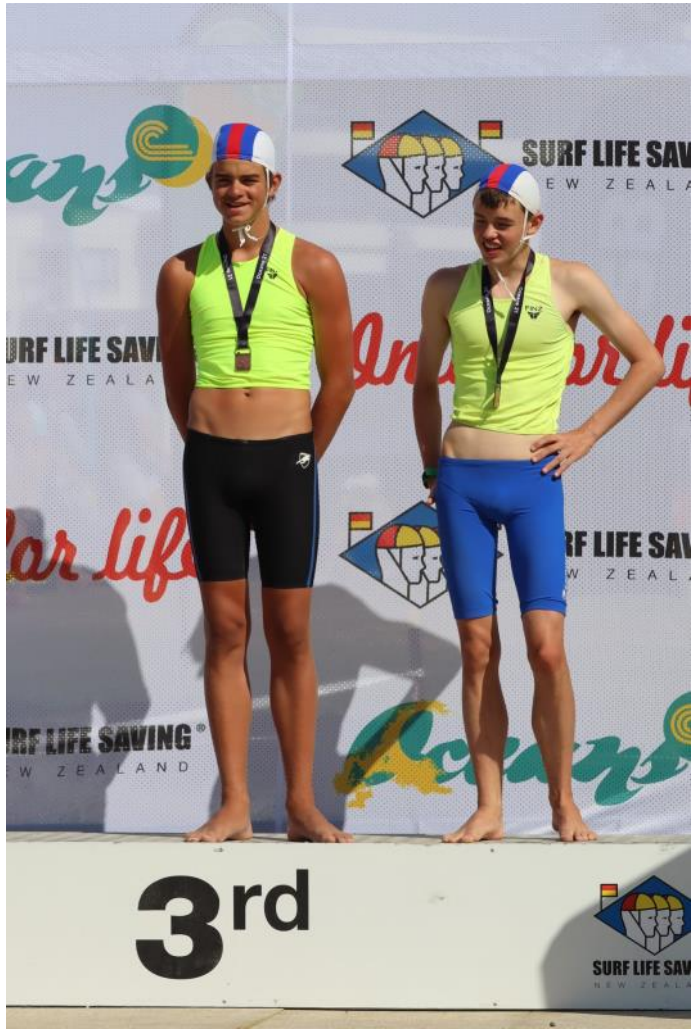
