Lifesaving Chair's Report

Well 2019/20 was an interesting season for lifesaving.

Whilst the Summer seems like a lifetime ago, it was a relentless one with regards to the weather and the hot days we received. A huge thank you must go to those who volunteer for our club and make our beach safe, whether it be visible in the form of wearing the Red and Yellow uniform and patrolling Orewa Beach and Wenderholm, or less visible in coordinating, training and supporting our members as they do the things they love.

From a lifesaving perspective it was yet another successful year with no drownings or serious injuries at our beaches, but plenty of minor first aids and preventative actions taking place and the large numbers of people keeping lifeguards on their toes. It was cut short due to the lockdown and reduced some of the service we gave to the community, but we still provided a significant contribution

Our efforts in the continued right through though the COVID-19 lockdown and Tom Onley and Faron Turner must be commended with their coordination of the callout teams being prepared with PPE, processes and our facility being managed in the event of an emergency.



There were a reduced number of Lifeguard events this season with the beach series no longer being run at Orewa, but we still had a presence at some events for swimming, running and Waka Ama. Even with a couple of events being cancelled due to the outbreak, this avenue of lifesaving still offers opportunities to our members as well as some much-needed finances for the club.

The family of lifeguards is still growing, with 21 lifeguards qualified this season and more of our members are gaining skills and qualifications that not only help in their lifesaving activities, but are applicable elsewhere. Next year will see more a greater demand for first aid and IRB qualifications, and with training taken place throughout the Winter and Spring, now is the time to put your hand up and get involved.

As we look forwards into next season and beyond, we know we will face further challenges. The pandemic has, and will continue, to change the way the world works. Funding may become harder to obtain, the ways in which we train may evolve, as well as the ways in which we patrol and respond. As ever, we acknowledge and embrace the change focussing on the positives that can come with reviewing the ways in which we work and look forward to being back in the uniform with you all next season.

Surf Sports Chair's Report

As I write this report, we are going through the COVID pandemic which is forcing us all to rethink and change the way we do things. Along with all other sporting codes, surf sports and our lifesaving organisation in general will be affected, how big the impact we won't know until the year progresses.

We started the season on a high at the Winter Pool events, with the seniors contributing to the overall combined club points, claiming the Northern Region Pool Champs title for the 2nd season running, following this up a few weeks later finishing top club at the NZ Pool Championships. Our strong Masters swimmers also continued with their formidable form claiming top accolades at both events.

As in previous years, we had a small team of our pool swimmers travel across to Australia to compete at the Queensland and Australian Pool Championships. All the swimmers did incredibly well, with some fine individual and team podium finishes, and they enjoyed the experience offered competing in a different environment. Special thanks to Sandra Burrow for coaching and chaperoning the team at the Australian Pool Championships.

We had a slight change to our coaching style going into the Summer season, introducing a dual mentoring role with Zac Franich and James Scott sharing the Senior Coaching load and the opportunity for our senior leadership athletes to support the U12 and U14 junior coaching programme. This approach may be considered again going into the future seasons, as the overall consensus from all stakeholders was a positive one.

At the NZ surf boat trials held at Whangamata early December, our U23 Womens boat crew, 'The Amazons', team of Tyler McDowell, Meisha Knegt, Lucy Murden, Kendra Stinson (in for injured Ashleigh Paotama) and sweep Mark McCarthy successfully trialed and were selected as the NZ U23 Development Crew to represent New Zealand at the annual Trans-Tasman Surf Boat Challenge, held at Mollymook beach, Sydney, in February. The unpredictable Aussie surf

conditions saw a beach venue change on day 2 of the competition, not deterring our team to continue to do their best, they managed to be one of the only NZ crews to make it out and back in one event. The team gained valuable experience representing New Zealand which they were able to capitalise on as the season progressed.

Progressing throughout the season, we witnessed all our teams and athletes grow and settle into the season. The busiest time of the year on the senior calendar runs from early January through to mid-March, with carnivals, boat series events, Northern, Eastern and other regional events, on pretty much every other weekend. The club and equipment are utilised non-stop, and there is a frenzy for senior athletes, who are all surf lifesaving guards, working their training sessions around their rostered volunteer patrols.

This year we have had one of the largest contingents of boat crews, with 10 crews competing during the season, comprising 1 Open Mens, 3 Open Womens, U23 Mens, U23 Womens, U19 Womens, 2 Masters Mens and 1 Master Womens crew. All teams achieved success across the season at various events entered, and it was great to have a Masters Womens crew again after a few years' hiatus. This special group of ladies had the row of their season, claiming Silver in the Long Course at the North Island Surf Boat Champs held at Waihi. The joy and sheer delight (and possibly relief!) on their faces after the final race is what surf sports is all about. Not always the winning, but the sense of achievement and camaraderie.

Fortunately, the lockdown began two weeks post Senior Nationals, held at Midway Beach, Gisborne. The Masters boat teams, The Ogres and The Jets and canoe team, The Hibiscus Blues competed in incredibly tough conditions on the first day of the event, but managed to battle through boats, people and canoes flying in all directions, to all 3 teams coming away with podium finishes in their respective age groups.

As is typical of the unpredictability of the surf at Midway Beach, the tough surf conditions for the individual athletes saw the under 16 arenas moved down to Waikanae Beach on their first day of competition. Great effort from the team managers and parents to move everyone down in a seamless fashion.

The surf settled down slightly for days 2 and 3, but the athletes still had to battle through cold, wind and rain, challenging conditions and programme and arena changes. I was very proud to see how everyone coped with this. Who said surf was a Summer sport?! We had excellent results again this year, podium finishes across the many disciplines we offer, with a very positive vibe emanating at our team dinner from all the competitors, supporters and parents. Orewa placed a very commendable 7th place overall after the three full days of racing.

We were fortunate to have 9 surf officials from Orewa in attendance at Nationals. On behalf of all our senior athletes, I would like to say a special "thank you" to all our volunteer surf officials for their support during the year in general, but would like to acknowledge in particular John Chapman, Deb Walker, Trevor Keinzley, Benny Larsen, Brenda Larsen, Dave Shanks, Kevin Stinson, Tim Rogers and Wayne Franich, who freely give up most of their weekends and time to volunteer as officials at senior carnivals throughout the year, at both the Winter pool events and Summer beach events. We also have great support from event guards and many other volunteer officials. Surf sports event cannot function without your support.

Again, we are thankful and extremely fortunate to have the on-going generosity of all our Business House Sponsors and individual donors, who unwaveringly continue to provide

significant contributions. We are able to maintain the senior equipment and provide much needed replacements ensuring we have sufficient equipment for training and competition purposes.

Our Sports committee this year has been as robust as ever, and worked tirelessly to deliver another successful sports programme at Orewa. The hours the committee put in to ensuring the smooth operations pre, post and during the season is immense, and I would like to personally thank Steve, Cameron, Dani, Zoe, Paul, Toby and Jon, James and Zac for their support and contribution to our success.

Wishing everyone another great season ahead, and one that is hopefully COVID free.

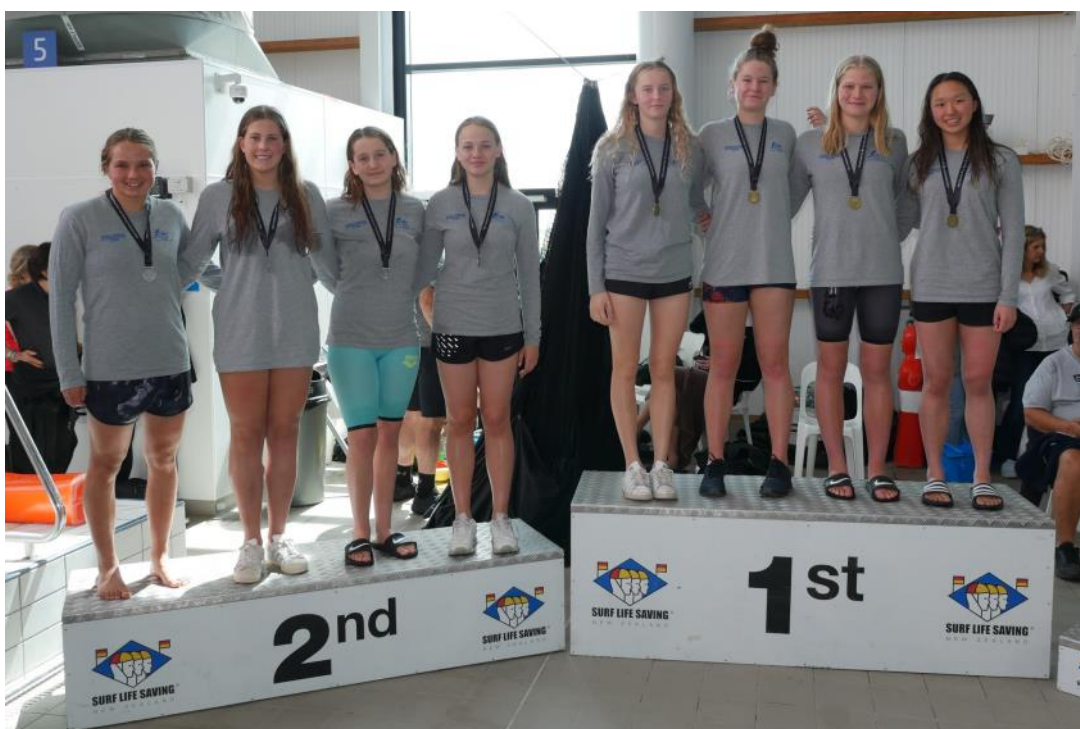

It's such a privilege to be part of the team who get to bring surf fun, safety and lifesaving skills to these young people, training such important life skills. We are committed to instilling an awareness and respect for the sea, an appreciation of fun and safe practices when they are at the beach and an ability to act with confidence should someone need assistance. And while all these are key components of what we teach, the social side is equally important. So encouraging play and friendship is what completes the picture and inspires our youth to continue to become active lifeguards in the future. We definitely saw a lot of this being integrated into our sessions including lots of play with first aid practises and tube rescues in all age groups.



The theme for this season for the Junior team was, let's take a fresh perspective, try different things, and keep our children and our families at the heart of all we do. To give us focus in our discussions and decisions, we agreed on three key themes to run through all our efforts. Offer our junior members: an Education in all things lifesaving, an Experience of putting their skills to the test in fun and competitive events, and opportunities to Exemplify what it means to be part of our club, part of Lifesaving through living our R.E.A.L. values. If any of these ideas met all three themes, we put them into action. Some of the new things we tried included an evolved patching process, a new social communication tool (TR), ability based training opportunities and of course,

a lots of first aid practises. Overall, having these three criteria, Educate, Experience, Exemplify, meant a lot more consistency in what our members experienced and empowered our coaches to try new activities out, experiment a little and evolve our processes.

Other activities included jumping off the docks, a fun 'wave' day at Waipu, diving under the Waterfalls and a 'camp' challenge with the older Juniors leading the littlest in teams to complete challenges organised by the parents. The children and parents definitely had a fun filled summer camp we all will remember, building those key friendships for life.

With an abrupt end, given Covid19, the team rallied together for the last time in the season to ensure all our members still had their prizegiving. So again, trying something new, we did a virtual video prizegiving in place of our planned family picnic on the beach. The junior committee is keen to continue to grow our program, support our young 'lifesavers' to enjoy and embrace surf in the way that bests suits them, listen to our members feedback, and most of all, have fun together.

Thank you to all my committee members, you have been amazing to work with and I look forward to another year. Thank you to all the volunteers for giving your time in both water support and coaching during the training, managing at carnivals, being our surf officials and when we fundraise, working the BBQ, carnival support or doing a shift at our annual Orewa Surf Sounds and Santa Parade.
